BEEF MARKET UPDATE & BCQA TRAINING - MARCH 1ST



As we get started into 2023, we will have a "Beef Market Update & BCQA Training" next Wednesday evening March 1st, starting at 6:00 p.m., at the Ohio Co. Extension Center.

We will have Dr. Kenny Burdine, Extension Livestock Marketing Specialist, discuss the current market conditions and what he expects beef markets to do throughout 2023.

At the conclusion of his discussion, I will provide a Beef Cattle Quality Assurance (BCQA) training for any producers needing re-certification or to be certified for the first time. Remember, BCQA practices are essential management skills for all beef producers to use in their operations, so we may assure consumers that our products are the most consistent, safest, most wholesome beef products in the world.

For those planning to participate in the CAIP program this year, if you are cost-sharing in the "Large Animal" category you must have a current BCQA certification. So, this will be an opportunity to get that taken care of. There is a \$5 fee for the BCQA training.

PESTICIDE SAFETY EDUCATION – MARCH

The first opportunity the renew your pesticide safety education certification, will be Friday, March 3rd, from 9:00 a.m. till noon. The program will be held at the Ohio Co. Extension Center on Clay St. in Hartford.

For many years the 'Pesticide Safety Education Training" was considered only for people using restricted-use pesticides, but with todays' pesticide products all pesticide users should attend the training. Pesticide products are safer than they have ever been, but if not used properly, they can be harmful to not only the user, but the environment, as well.

So, check your cards to be sure you have a valid certification for 2023, if you need to purchase restricted-

use pesticides. Cards expire on December 31 of the year of expiration. The "Pesticide Safety Education" is

free and open to anyone wanting to attend.

- Kentucky-Tennessee Cowman's Kind Bull Sale –
 March 4th at the Ky-TN Livestock Market in
 Guthrie. The sale starts at Noon. The sale
 includes 20+ bulls representing Angus,
 Balancers, Black Hereford, Gelbvieh, Herford,
 Sim/Angus, and Simmental breeds.
- Pleasant Hills Farms/Early March Madness Bull & Heifer Sale – February 25th at the United Producers Regional Livestock Market in Bowling Green. The sale starts at 1:30 p.m. The sale includes 88 bulls of Angus, Simmental, and Sim/Angus breeding. Also, they will have 50 commercial heifers for sale.

KY DEPT. OF AG – NUISANCE WEED SPRAYING PROGRAM

Each spring the Ky Dept. of Agriculture coordinates a nuisance weed control program for Kentucky producers. Under the program, a producer can spray 10 acres of pasture/haylands for weeds having a negative impact, such as thistles or buttercup. The KDA provides

the chemical and boomless sprayer and the producer must provide the tractor, water and labor for spraying.

There is a maximum of seven participants allowed per county. Participants may only apply every 36 months. To apply, go to the KDA's nuisance weed website at:
