### MAPLE DAY SHOWCASES GROWING SYRUP INDUSTRY – FEB. 4<sup>TH</sup>



Kentucky maple syrup producers will open their facilities to the public, this Saturday, Feb. 4, for the fourth annual Kentucky Maple Day. Sponsored by the University of Kentucky Cooperative Extension Service and the Kentucky Maple Syrup Association, the day allows the public to visit the state's maple syrup producing farms and sugarhouses to observe syrup's production and purchase locally produced maple syrup products.

Ohio County's own Hitchel Farms, operated by Ben & Bekki Hitchel will open their farm to visitors this Saturday, February 4th, from 9:00 a.m. till 4:00 p.m., for the Ky Maple Day. Their farm is located at 4735 Rob Roy Rd., outside Cromwell.

"There is currently a great deal of interest in the maple syrup industry in Kentucky," said Billy Thomas, extension forester with the UK College of Agriculture, Food and Environment Department of Forestry and Natural Resources. "Kentucky Maple Day is not only a great opportunity for the public to learn more about our growing syrup industry, but according to producers, it has also increased their visibility and revenue. In addition, the day provides a reminder to all that Kentucky's woodlands are a valuable resource which provides many benefits." "Kentucky Maple Day highlights a Kentucky

forest product that is not only delicious but can serve as an important agritourism catalyst during winter for Kentucky's farm operations," Thomas said.

Activities will vary at each location. Producers will showcase their operations and sell pure maple syrup and syrup products, and some will also offer tours of their sugar bush and sap-collection systems.

Organizers recommend those interested in attending call local producers in advance if they have any questions about what activities and products their location offers.

#### KY DEPT. OF AG – NUISANCE WEED SPRAYING PROGRAM

Each spring the Ky Dept. of Agriculture coordinates a nuisance weed control program for Kentucky producers. Under the program, a producer can spray 10 acres of grassland for weeds having a negative impact, such as thistles or buttercup. The KDA provided the chemical and boomless sprayer and the producer must provide the tractor, water and labor for spraying.

There is a maximum of seven participants allowed per county. Participants may only apply every 36 months. ## BACKYARD POULTRY PRODUCTION WEBINARS

You can only apply from February 1 thru February 28<sup>th</sup>. Backyard chicken flocks are popular in urban and suburban communities throughout the country. Most owners raise them for eggs, meat, controlling pests and sometimes, just as pets. Preparation is essential for a thriving backyard flock.

The U.K. College of Agriculture, Food and Environment is leading a series of webinars throughout the coming year on various aspects of raising backyard poultry, in conjunction with the Universities of Wisconsin, Florida, Minnesota, Ohio State University, and Utah State University.
