

HOW TO PREPARE AND PRESENT A 4-H CLASSROOM AND/OR COUNTY SPEECH/DEMONSTRATION

- 1. 4-H Classroom Speeches or Demonstrations should be no longer than 1-2 minutes in length. (Due to limited classroom time.)
- 2. Speeches may be on any topic. No visual aids allowed.
- Demonstrations may be on any topic. Visual aids are allowed and should include finished products, pictures, posters, costumes, any tool or utensil, etc. that will aid in completion of the demonstration. Google or power-point slides are permitted.
- 4. All Presentations should include the following: Title Name your presentation.

Introduction – should be short and should get the audience's attention.

Main Points – the longest and most important part of your presentation. Include 2-4 main points.

Closing – Restate your main ideas again. Tell the audience exactly what you want them to believe.

DELIVERY OF YOUR 4-H SPEECH/DEMONSTRATION

- Make Eye Contact look at your audience don't read.
- Use Gestures look natural.
- Perfect Posture stand in comfortable position.
- Speaking Voice speak loudly for all to hear.
- Smile- your face should reflect the attitude of your speech.
- Using Quotes? remember to give credit.
- Voice Emphasis emphasize words or phrases with pauses, loudness or softness of voice.
- Notes you may use note cards or index cards ("3x5" or 4"x6").
- PRACTICE! PRACTICE, MAKES PERFECT.



2024 4-H CAMP



Ohio County will attend 4-H Camp, June 25-28, 2024, at the West Kentucky 4-H Camp in Dawson

Springs. Ohio County will be camping with Henderson and Webster Counties. 4-H Camp registration forms will be available March 1. Youth age range to attend 4-H Camp are 9-14 years old. Youth going into 4th grade in the fall of 2024 are eligible to attend the 2024 4-H Camp. Youth will be accepted on a first come first serve basis.

The 2024 fee for 4-H Camp is \$250 for 4 days and three nights, meals, lodging, activities, camp t-shirt and transportation If 4-H Camp fees are paid in full and required included. paperwork are submitted by Friday, May 10, 2024, a \$25 discount will be applied to 4-H Camp fee. After the May 10 deadline the camp fee will be \$300. No Exceptions to this Deadline. Due to limited cabin space, youth may be placed on a waiting list. More information will be released in February. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to transport their animals to the validation site. EXHIBITOR will pay for tags at time of tagging.
