

Ages are based on the "4-H Age" which is the members age on January 1st of the program year (Sept. 1 – Aug. 31). # 2023 YOUTH AGRICULTURAL INCENTIVE PROGRAM



The Youth Agricultural Incentives Program (YAIP) guidelines were developed to facilitate a growing need for a specialized program that would

encourage youth to engage in and explore agricultural opportunities.

#### Student Eligibility

- 1. **Applicant** shall be enrolled in elementary, middle or high school, this includes home schooled students.
- 2. Applicant shall be at least 9 years of age by January 1, 2023.
  - Age is based on 4-H program entry age.
  - Program is not available for the Clover Bud age group of 4-8 years
  - County residency is not a requirement, but must be enrolled in Ohio County Schools.
- 3. Applicant shall provide their individual Social Security Number (SSN).
- 4. Applicant shall have parental consent if under the age of 18. (See Parental Consent Section)
- 5. Mentorship **is required** from one of the following types of organizations:
  - a. 4-H Leader or Extension Agent
  - b. FFA Leader or School Ag Teacher
  - c. Other Agricultural Organization

Mentors shall be willing to provide consultation or assistance for the length of the program and <u>shall not</u> be from the applicant's immediate family.

# <u>AGRICULTURE PROJECT INVESTMENT AREAS</u> (Youth may select up to 2 Investment Areas)

Agricultural Diversification Includes: Greenhouse, Horticulture, Hydroponics, Technology-Computer Software, Value-Added Marketing, Wildlife Management; Animal Production includes: Beef, Dairy, Equine, Goat, Sheep, Rabbit, Swine, Poultry, Bees, Livestock Barn; Forage Improvement includes: Seeding; Showmanship includes: Beef, Dairy, Equine, Goar, Sheep, Rabbit, Swine, Poultry;

**Supervised Agriculture Experience** (SAE) includes: SAE project, Environmental project; **Country Ham Project** includes: Ham purchase, Project supplies, Cost of participation in 4-H Country ham Project.

#### **Guidelines for Funding**

- Funding for all projects shall not exceed \$1000 per youth.
- Reimbursements shall not exceed 50% of the total project cost for all eligible expenses
- Projects must be complete with all requirements met before funds can be disbursed.

- No Cash receipts accepted. Bank/Credit Card Statements required to be reimbursed.
- All investments are for the individual youth and shall not be a part of a larger school, organization or family operation.
