



2024 KENTUCKY 4-H ACHIEVEMENT PROGRAM FORMS (Due November 15) Motivation and the use of incentives are essential to positive youth development. 4-H Youth Development programs provide opportunities for creativity in a learn-by-doing environment and encourage youth to become involved in projects and activities. The 4-H Achievement Program recognizes 4-H participants who have outstanding accomplishments and to provide an incentive for youth to increase their knowledge, skills, and abilities. The Achievement Program allows 4-H Youth to tell their 4-H Story start at age 9 up to a 4-H Member's current age. The 2023-

2024 program year for submission will be the reporting of 4-H achievements that has occurred during their 4-H career.
