

#### ₩2024 4-H POSTER CONTEST RULES 🗱

- 1. 4-H Poster may be completed at school or at home by 4-H youth. Parents/others may help youth with design only, but should not do the work for the youth.
- 2. 4-H Poster must be on 14"x11" poster board ONLY A white poster board is will be supplied FREE in 4-6<sup>th</sup> grade classrooms county-wide or may be picked up at the Extension Office located at 1337 Clay Street in Harford. Youth may purchase and use other colors of poster board at their own expense.
- 3. The 4-H poster must have a 4-H Theme incorporated into the design. The 4-H Clover or the words "4-H" must be on the poster at least once.
- 4. Youth may draw or use clip art/stencils in the design of the 4-H poster. Crayons, markers, paint, colored pencils and/or stick-on letters, clip art, etc. may be used, glued, or attached to the poster.
- 5. 4-H member's <u>full name, teacher, grade and school</u> should be printed neatly on back of the 4-H poster. Name should not be on front of poster.

### <u>ITEMS NOT ALLOWED – (Ineligible for Champion consideration)</u>

- 1. No glitter of <u>any kind</u> is allowed (pen, loose glitter or glitter stickers).
- 2. 4-H Poster cannot be 3-D. Items on poster can be no higher than 1/8". Decorations/designs cannot hang over the edge of the poster board.
- 3. 4-H Poster is wrong size/type poster board, messy, folded or rolled up, or does not have full name on the poster will receive ribbon only.

# NO COPYRIGHTED MATERIAL OF ANY TYPE: (Poster will be disqualified)

- Sports Teams College or Professional, etc.
- NASCAR No Drivers or Sponsors names, etc.

#### AWARDS - Judging will take place by grades.

- 1. 4-H participants will receive a 4-H ribbon (blue/red/green)
- 2. 4-6 grade classroom will have a room champion (Purple rosette ribbon).
- 3. Each school will have a school champion for 4<sup>th</sup> 5<sup>th</sup>, and 6<sup>th</sup> grades that will receive a trophy.
- 4. One County Champion will be selected for each grade level from all School champions. A trophy will be awarded to each of the County Champions in 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup>, 6<sup>th</sup> grades. Home school youth (4th-6th) and Teens will be placed in separate county groups. A trophy will be awarded to each group.

Contest deadline: 4-H posters are due at the October 4-H School or Community club meeting or to the Extension Office by October 31. School Club deadlines may be set by a 4-H classroom teacher.

### 2024 KENTUCKY 4-H ACHIEVEMENT PROGRAM

(Due November 1) Motivation and the use of incentives are essential to positive youth development. 4-H Youth Development programs provide opportunities for creativity in a learn-by-doing environment and encourage youth to become involved in projects and activities. The 4-H Achievement Program recognizes 4-H participants who have outstanding accomplishments and to provide an incentive for youth to increase their knowledge, skills, and abilities. The Achievement Program allows 4-H Youth to tell their 4-H Story start at age 9 up to a 4-H Member's current age. The 2023 program year for submission will be the reporting of 4-H achievements that has occurred during their 4-H career. # 2024 YOUTH AGRICULTURAL INCENTIVE PROGRAM

**The Youth Agricultural Incentives Program** (YAIP) was developed to facilitate a growing need for a specialized program that would encourage youth to engage in and explore agricultural opportunities.

#### **Student Eligibility**

- Applicant shall be enrolled in elementary, middle, or high school, this includes home schooled students.
- 2. Applicant shall be at least 9 years of age by December 31, 2023.
  - Age is based on 4-H program entry age.
  - Program is not available for the Clover Bud age group of 4-8 years
  - County residency is not a requirement, but must be enrolled in Ohio County Schools.
- Applicant shall provide their individual Social Security Number (SSN).
- 4. Applicant shall have parental consent if under the age

of 18. (See Parental Consent Section)

 Mentorship <u>is required</u> from one of the following types of organizations:

> a. 4-H Leader or Extension Agent



c. Other Agricultural Organization

Mentors shall be willing to provide consultation or assistance for the duration of the program.

- **Supervised Agriculture Experience** (SAE) includes: SAE project, Environmental project;

#### **Guidelines for Funding**

NTUCKY AGRICULTURAL

VELOPMENT

- Funding for all projects shall not exceed \$1000 per youth. Funding is based on eligible applicants.
- Reimbursements shall not exceed 50% of the total project cost for all eligible expenses.
- Projects must be complete with all requirements met before funds can be disbursed.
- No Cash receipts accepted. Bank and or Credit Card Statements required to be reimbursed.
- All investments are for the individual youth and shall not be a part of a larger school, organization or family operation.

- YAIP Applications must be completed and returned to the Extension Office between November 1, 2024, and no later than 12:00 pm (noon) on Friday, December 20, 2024.

YAIP Application paperwork must be submitted to the Ohio County Extension Office located at 1337 Clay Street Hartford by the absolute deadline of 12:00 pm (noon) on Friday December 20, 2024 for consideration of youth cost share funds.




